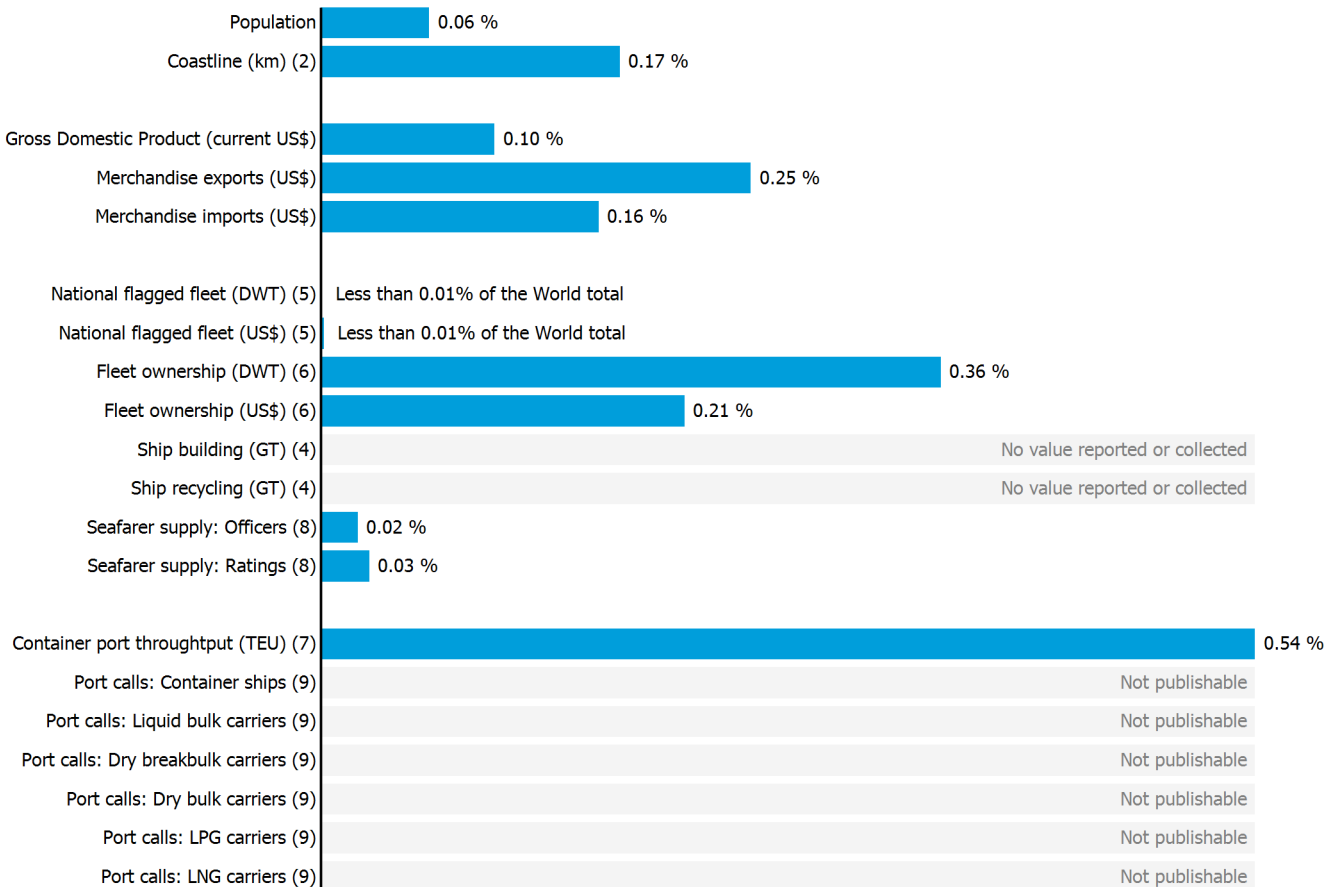

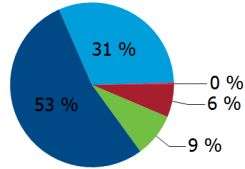

Export structure by product group in 2023

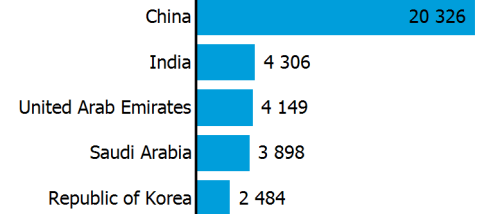

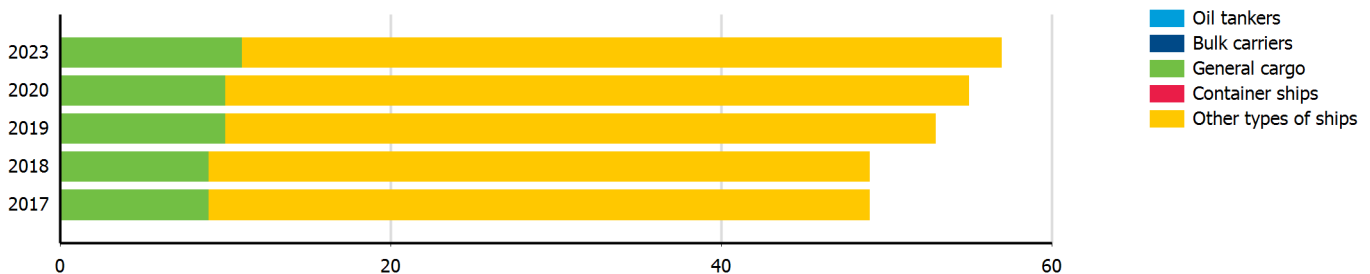

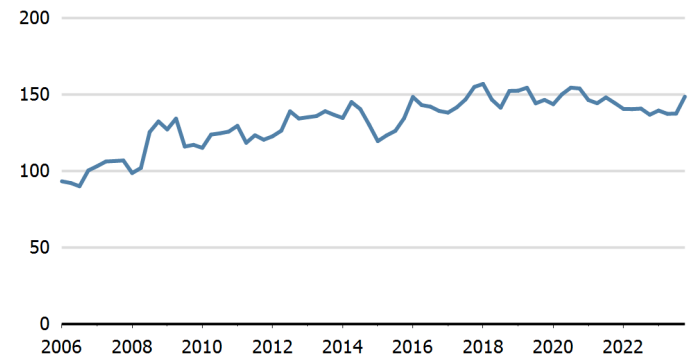

Average Q1 2023=100



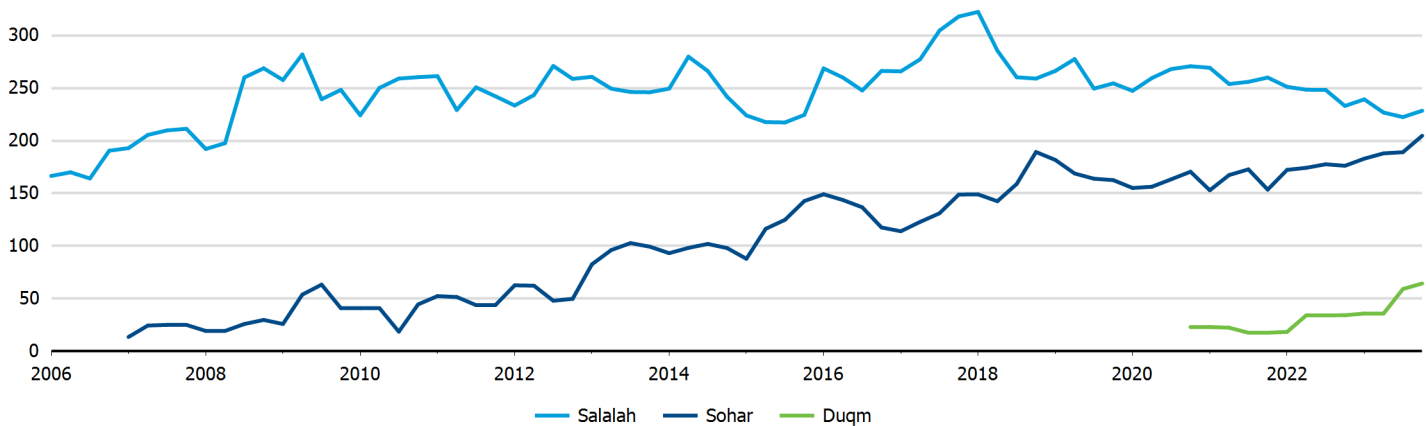
