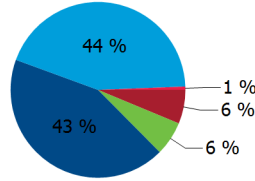

### Export structure by product group in 2022

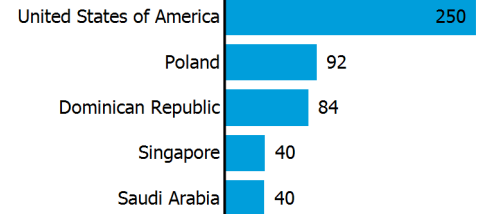

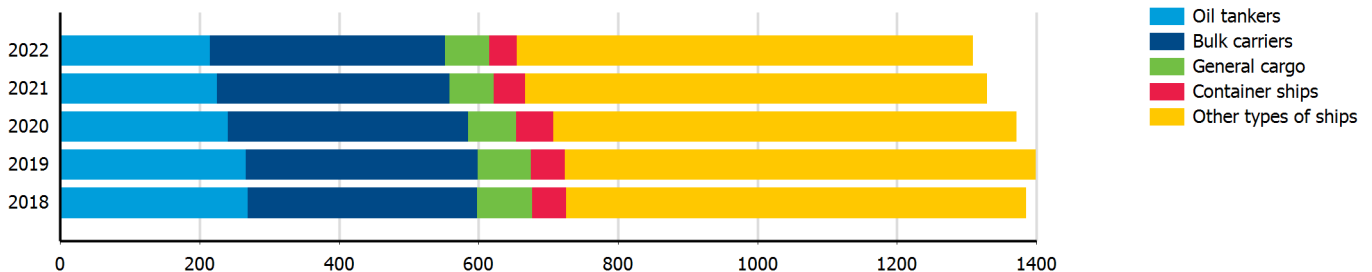

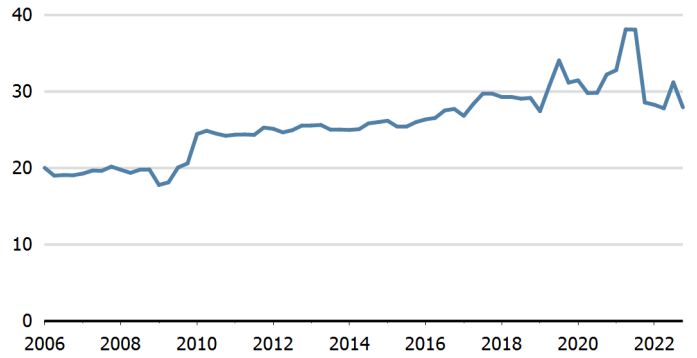

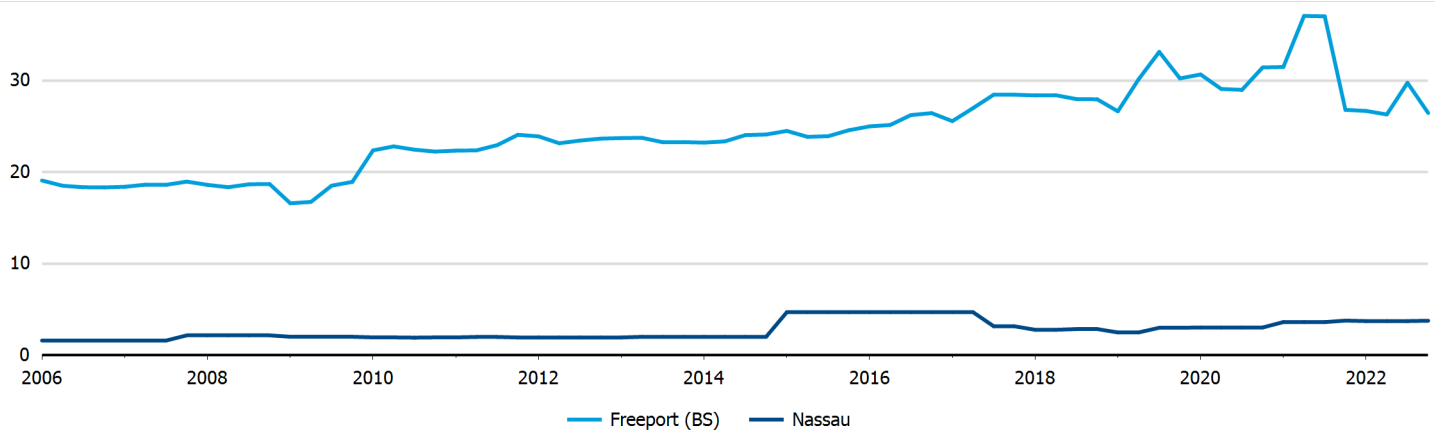
